



Kathleen Lauder Leadership Scholarship

The Kathleen Lauder Leadership Scholarship is an annual award for Basotho students in a Help Lesotho twinned school to attend a 6-day Leadership Camp, all expenses paid in mid-January, 2007.

The Scholarship is in honour of a Canadian woman, 'M'e Kathleen Lauder who has herself shown great leadership in the foundation of Help Lesotho, as well as in many other organizations. 'M'e Lauder is an Anglican, with twenty-five years of experience in international development. She cares deeply for the children of Lesotho and for developing leadership in young people in particular. She has worked all her life to improve the well being of others. 'M'e Lauder and her husband Lorne Likely's family includes two daughters (Mai-lin [1989-2006] and Lee-lin) and three sons (Joe, Tim and Charlie).

Eligibility Criteria:

Award winners must:

- attend one of the HL twinned high schools;
- be in good standing with the teachers and principal;
- show evidence of good study habits, personal discipline, and effort.

Submission Process:

Candidates are to submit an essay (minimum of 200 words), in English, on:

1. The subject of leadership – what it means;
2. How one can recognize a good leader;
3. How good leadership will effect the HIV/AIDS crisis in Lesotho;
4. Why the writer wants to go to the Leadership Camp; and
5. What commitment the writer will make to become a leader in his or her community.
